CATHOLIC REFRESHER BOX

Baptism is the first sacrament of initiation aligning us to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Parents must promise to raise the child as a good Catholic, in Christ, and must provide Catholic-Christian religious instruction throughout the child's life until adulthood. Godparents must be one male, one female, 16 years of age or older. One godparent must be a baptized, confirmed practicing Catholic; the other (if not a Catholic) must be a baptized Christian. Adult Baptism is achieved by going through the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) classes.

Holy Eucharist: The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is the worship of God through Jesus. It is the real presence of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus which is our redemption. The late John Paul II rightly called the Eucharist, “*The Sacrament of our Redemption.*” The life giving events of the Lord's preaching, dying, and rising are represented to each new generation of believing Catholic-Christians through the ministry of bishops and priests and done at the command of Christ at the Last Supper, “*Do this in memory of Me.*” [Luke 22: 17-20] By receiving the Eucharist we continue to be nourished in the life of the Lord and grow into His risen likeness.

Penance is the sacrament of Christ's forgiveness. There are moments when we all need official forgiveness. There are moments when we must take the words of Jesus seriously, that He commissioned the apostles and their successors to forgive sin in His name. [John 20: 19-23]

Confirmation is the sacrament of initiation which further grafts us into the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus through the grace of the Holy Spirit. The same Spirit given at Pentecost (50th day after Easter) is given to us through the ministry of the Bishop, successor to the apostles. With our wanting it, God is ready to give it, His Holy Spirit, a Spirit of Wisdom, Counsel, Understanding, Knowledge, Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord. The ordinary minister of Confirmation is the Bishop.
