- ~ A Fact Finding/Futures Committee has been formed to discuss the need for additional PSR classroom space, and if needed how would it be provided. Several ideas are being explored.
- ~ One idea is to use the upper floor of the POB for classrooms. This was done for classes for two years and was effective.
- ~ If this were to be done, where should the priest be housed?
- ~ One idea is purchase the 310 Phillips Street house which is now for sale.
- ~ When the facts are in and discussed, an advisory vote will be taken by the Parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Council. It will be decided whether or not to move forward.
- ~ The Archdiocese would have to approve the purchase before we could make a decision.
- ~ Father Tony is not taking a position at this time.
- ~ We will keep you informed on the progress and let you know once a decision is made.

PRESENT TEXT FOR PEOPLE

We believe in one God the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made one in being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day he rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one, holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

JUST A THOUGHT

There is a room in church that few people have ever seen but this room is second only to one other. It is the sacristy and is second only to the sanctuary with the altar, on which the sacrament of the Eucharist takes place, the tabernacle, in which the extra consecrated hosts are housed and the pulpit or ambo, from which sacred Scripture is read at Mass. It is from this room that the altar is prepared for Mass, Weddings, Funerals, and Baptisms.

During the recent necessary cost cutting activity, I discovered that there is no budget for the sacristy. The sacristans "make do" with what they have and rarely purchase anything new. There are things that are needed and things that are wanted to make our church and the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass even more beautiful.

My thought is this: why not offer, to the parishioners, a chance to choose a needed or wanted item as a memorial to a loved one. The price of some of the items, while somewhat costly, are not prohibitively so. True, they won't be as extravagant as the beautiful stained glass windows but they will be things sorely needed. So, beginning in this bulletin, we will list these items and their cost (as accurately as possible) and, we hope, that some kind persons will select the item they would like to donate. We will announce, in the bulletin, who made the gift unless they wish to remain anonymous. We hope that you will consider this thought and let one of the sacristans, Gail, or Fr. Tony know that you would like to help. We will show you the item or items in the church supply catalog so you will know exactly what it is you will be paying for.

As you consider this idea, may I suggest that you stay after Mass some Saturday or Sunday and ask the sacristan on duty to show you the sacristy and the vestry downstairs, which is really an extension of the sacristy upstairs.
