FOR YOUR INFORMATION ...

- ▶ A Fact Finding/Futures Committee was formed to discuss the need for additional PSR classroom space, and how it would be provided. Several ideas have been explored.
- ▶ One idea is to use the upper floor of the POB for classrooms. This was done for classes for two years and was effective. If this action is taken, we would purchase the 310 Phillips Street house which is currently up for sale.
- ▶ The second idea is to add on to the back of the Rectory, thus providing us with 7-8 classrooms.
- ▶ The facts are in and have been thoroughly discussed. An open forum for parishioners occurred on Tuesday evening, June 15. An advisory vote was taken by the Parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Council following the open meeting. It was decided to put in a bid for \$225,000 (the house is listed at \$270,000). In the meantime, exploration of costs pertaining to an addition to the rectory will continue.
- ▶ The Archdiocese will have to give final approval before we can move ahead on either option (house or addition). Before the archdiocese can give its permission the owner of the house needs to accept our bid, contingent upon diocesan regulations/whole house inspections and title search, etc.
- ▶ Father Tony is not taking a position at this time.
- ▶ We will keep you informed on the progress.

JUST A THOUGHT

This is the last week this will be in the bulletin, however, we will keep you posted on what has been donated and what is still needed.

There is a room in church that few people have ever seen but this room is second only to one other. It is the sacristy and is second only to the sanctuary with the altar, on which the sacrament of the Eucharist rests, the tabernacle, in which the extra consecrated hosts are housed and the pulpit or ambo, from which sacred Scripture is read at Mass. It is from this room that the altar is prepared for Mass, Weddings, Funerals, and Baptisms.

During the recent necessary cost cutting activity, I discovered that there is no budget for the sacristy. The sacristans "make do" with what they have and rarely purchase anything new. There are things that are needed and things that are wanted to make our church and the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass even more beautiful.

My thought is this: why not offer, to the parishioners, a chance to choose a needed or wanted item as a memorial to a loved one. The price of some of the items, while somewhat costly, are not prohibitively so. True, they won't be as extravagant as the beautiful stained glass windows but they will be things sorely needed. So, beginning in this bulletin, we will list these items and their cost (as accurately as possible) and, we hope, that some kind persons will select the item they would like to donate. We will announce, in the bulletin, who made the gift unless they wish to remain anonymous. We hope that you will consider this thought and let one of the sacristans, Gail, or Fr. Tony know that you would like to help. We will show you the item or items in the church supply catalog so you will know exactly what it is you will be paying for.

As you consider this idea, may I suggest that you stay after Mass some Saturday or Sunday and ask the sacristan on duty to show you the sacristy and the vestry downstairs, which is really an extension of the sacristy upstairs. *Respectfully yours, The Sacristans of St. Paul*
